Anything we bring into a pro-life discussion apart from the central theme can get us off track.

It is essential to first establish that abortion is the intentional killing of an innocent human being, then the videos/images may make our point more persuasive. It will show that the clinics kill human beings, and the way they kill them makes it especially evil.

Jesus states the things that are impossible with people are possible with God. This teaching is quickly followed by the rich outcast, Zacchaeus, coming to faith in Jesus, thus demonstrating that with God, nothing is impossible.

Clearly with God it was possible for a rich outcast like Zacchaeus to have a saving faith, and it is possible for those in the clenches of the sin of abortion and its severe mental and emotional damage to have saving faith and healing.
